**Resolved:** WTC object to the introduction of on street parking charges for the following reasons.

- Concern was raised about the lack of access to Smart technology for residents to be able to pay short term fees.
- The proposal was felt to be detrimental to other initiatives to support Town Centres.
- The introduction of these charges so close to the changes in the car park fees was felt to be inappropriate, the impact should be reviewed before on street charges are introduced.

#### **Community Banking Hub**

We have submitted an application to LINK to highlight the difficulties Ware is experiencing with regards to accessing banking facilities. LINK is the UK's largest cash machine network, connecting virtually all of the UK's ATMs and providing communities with access to cash through services such as cashback at retailers' tills and Banking Hubs. LINK is in the process of assessing our application.

#### **Tudor Square Sunday Market**

Our market in partnership with Southern Maltings launches on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> Feb and will be held the third Sunday of each month (excluding August and January). Southern Maltings are managing the stall holders. The first market has an excellent mix of local artisan products, crafts, gifts, a cooking demonstration, and a choir performing. Future dates are:

#### Ware Town Council Website & social media

The website has had 20k views in the period Nov 22- Jan 23 from 9.1k visitors. Social media analytics are available and can be forwarded separately but show very high levels of reach and engagement in the same period. The most popular posts are those relating to the Priory Park works, the Lido and the town centre business promotions. Hootsuite software now allows us to benchmark against other local councils and relevant pages.

#### **National Association of Local Councils Accreditation**

Quality Gold accreditation was awarded to us in December and is valid for 4 years.

#### Christmas 2023

The Ware Bear has reached his 'end of life' as expected with large outdoor illuminated set-pieces due to the degradation in the covering material. His end was hastened by the vandalism suffered over the past two festive seasons. It would be helpful for Councillors to consider their thoughts for 2023 options to be discussed at the next C&E meeting in May.

#### **Shared Prosperity Funding**

We are proposing that Ware seek funding for the installation of self-cleaning town centre toilets.

# **Town Centre Spring Clean**
