


- A collaborative partner with 8+ years of experience

"This social enterprise is great because it's affordable for our people...and its great for the climate in reducing waste and is part of our Net Zero 2040 commitment."



What Library of Things provides



Off-the-shelf item rental service at a fraction of the cost of in-house delivery



Fully-trained maintenance technician and telephone support during opening hours



- Ongoing training and resources on marketing best practices to support your team
- Network with other council sustainability teams and local sustainability leaders.

What the Council provides

- Cross-council team to amplify awareness of the service internally and externally
- - Leads ongoing marketing and engagement to recruit new users to the service



- Embed and promote behaviour change to help meet NetZero targets
- Sponsor free borrows for residents and funding for skills programme (optional)

The start-up and operating costs

LoT: Cost & Fees

Set-up costs (Fixed)

- £20,000 Fabrication/Installation
- £10,000 Items for rent
- £15,000 LoT fee

£45,000 Total set-up cost

Operating costs

- LoT retains rental income
- LoT uses rental income to employ maintenance technician & community marketer
- Where rental income does not cover all the operating costs, the shortfall is covered by the council
- Please see Licensor Operating Contribution document

LoT: Optional Services

(additional funding required)

Power Behaviour Change in Your Community

- Pre-opening feasibility study
- Sponsor items
- Limited period of free rentals to residents
- Annual programme of Skill Share classes eg.
